Combined Application for
CEAS Summer Grant
and
Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Summer Fellowships

Stanford graduate students who have completed three quarters of study are eligible to apply for a small number of summer grants available through the Center for East Asian Studies. The Center offers grants from both U.S. Department of Education (**FLAS**) and internal Stanford sources (**CEAS summer grants**). These grants are normally used for academically related summer work such as formal language training or coursework required for a graduate degree, dissertation research or dissertation write-up.

Students applying for both a CEAS summer grant and a FLAS fellowship need fill out only one application. (The enclosed financial statement is not required of students applying only for a FLAS fellowship, but it is required of students applying for a CEAS summer grant.)

Guidelines for CEAS Summer Awards:

- Graduate students who have completed three quarters of study at Stanford are eligible to apply for a small number of summer grants available through CEAS.
- Grants are used for academically related summer work such as formal language training or coursework required for a graduate degree, dissertation research, or dissertation write-up. CEAS funds are normally applied only toward enrollment and living expenses at Stanford.
- Graduate students ordinarily must be enrolled in a minimum of three units (or be enrolled with TGR status) to receive funding.

Guidelines for FLAS Fellowships in East Asian Languages:

- Summer FLAS Fellowships are awarded to graduate students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents and intend to devote full-time study to an intensive Chinese, Japanese, or Korean language program at an advanced level.
- Summer FLAS Fellowships for study at overseas institutions are awarded to continuing Stanford students only. All FLAS summer grant students must have the equivalent of three quarters of graduate study to be considered for funding. FLAS funding for a course of study at an overseas institution is approved on a case-by-case basis. Non-Stanford programs which have received Department of Education/Title VI approval in the past have included: The Hopkins-Nanjing Institute in China; the Princeton in Beijing Program; the People's University in Beijing; the NSK Summer Program at Ishikawa International Cultural Exchange Center; the International Christian University in Tokyo; and the Middlebury College's summer intensive language program. - Non-Stanford students who enroll in Stanford summer advanced intensive language programs are technically eligible for FLAS funding, but priority has typically been given to continuing Stanford students.
- Students who are studying Chinese, Japanese or Korean as a second Asian language may be eligible for FLAS funding at the intermediate or second-year level. (As an example, a student who finished fourth-year Chinese and is now studying Japanese is eligible for a summer FLAS to support intermediate second-year intensive language training.)
- Applicants judged already fluent in a given language, at a level equivalent to a native speaker, are ineligible for FLAS fellowship support.
- FLAS Fellowships include tuition and a stipend for intensive summer study equivalent to a full academic year of language study. Full-time study, without employment or research for which payment is received, is required unless it can be shown that employment does not prolong the time normally necessary for course completion.

All applications are due on February 1, 2007. *No exceptions will be made.* Each application must be supported by a letter of recommendation from one's major advisor (use the attached form) and a copy of the student's latest transcript. Stanford students may submit photocopies of the relevant transcripts. Students applying from other institutions must provide official transcripts. Forms and supporting materials should be sent to:
